Focused on God

I have a love-hate relationship with repetition. As someone diagnosed with obsessive-compulsive disorder, I'm constantly battling repetitive thoughts and the urge to act out repetitive impulses.

Still, I have found repetition to be immeasurably useful in my life of discipleship. One example is the repetitive nature of repentance. We are constantly turning from our sin and self toward God.

Another aspect of repetition I find helpful is the use of short formulaic prayers during meditation. I often employ a prayer popular with the Eastern Orthodox Church called the Jesus Prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner."

Regular repetition of these words helps me to focus my mind during prayer, but it also proves to have an impact on my obedience. When I remind myself of who God is—and who I am in relation to God—I am led to repentance.

Today's text has multiple verses that lend themselves to this sort of prayer. So, I invite you to a time of intimacy with God while you repeat these words. Feel free to repeat them as often as is helpful, either in communal worship or in your private devotion.

"To you, O Lord, I lift up my soul" (Psalm 25:1).

"Do not let me be put to shame" (Psalm 25:2b).

"Teach me your paths" (Psalm 25:4b).


