"It's like an early birthday present." He smiled more than a thirtynine-cent pocket folder deserved. Then I learned my student did not expect gifts, cake, a special dinner, or any other recognition of his thirteenth birthday.

It didn't help that we collected money to buy him cupcakes and school supplies. It didn't help that he looked happier than I had ever seen him. I was giving him one day of joy in a lifetime of hardship. He is one of many.

I worry about the world and the hate, violence, poverty, and crime that I see. I really can't do that much. I try. I donate, love people, pastor a church, and volunteer. Most people would say I am a good person. Yet, in the center of it all is my own selfishness. That bugs me. I help others, but I guard the things I want. I hold on to the traditions that secure my self-preservation. Sometimes I say with the apostle Paul: "Who can rescue me from this body of death?" (Romans 7:24).

Thanks be to God that Jesus came for that. Christ gives victory over hunger, evil, and death. Psalm 22 says that both the hungry and the full will bow down before the throne of God, and their needs will be satisfied. We need to help without feeling guilty for our own blessings. We are called to compassion, including caring for ourselves. I must bow down to Jesus and let God control my life, including my anxiety and my outreach.

In our rich and powerful culture, Lent calls us to remember that in Christ we find ways to be generous, to serve others, and to address our own shortcomings. The poor shall eat, and I will try to make that happen. What I can't do, I'll trust to Jesus.
