Let Us Love in Truth


When Pilate interrogated Jesus prior to his crucifixion, Jesus responded by proclaiming, "I was born and entered the world so that I could witness to the truth. Everyone who cares for the truth, who has any feeling for the truth, recognizes my voice." To which Pilate sarcastically retorted, "What is truth?" (John 18: 37-38, *The Message*).

Truth plays a central role in the Gospel of John. The word is applied much more frequently in the Fourth Gospel than in any other Gospel account. In one of most important verses from the Gospel of John, Jesus declares, "I am the way, and the truth, and the life" (14:6). Truth is also a central theme in the three epistles from John the apostle.

The New Testament Greek word for truth, *aletheia*, is sometimes translated as "unconcealed," or "revealed knowledge." But the word, derived as it is from Greek mythology, refers to the river Lethe, which was known as "the river of forgetfulness." Much like the word asymptomatic means without symptoms, *aletheia* can be translated "without forgetting." Don't forget the truth that God loves you and calls you to live in love.

1 John 3:18 suggests that "talking the talk" or even "walking the walk" when it's easy or convenient doesn't cut it. Extending an occasional loving gesture, or loving only those who love us, isn't enough. We are called to love in truth. We fulfill this calling by remaining ever mindful of Jesus' way of love. We love in truth when Jesus' command to love unconditionally and inclusively permeates our very being. Perhaps the call to love in truth can be understood as a reminder to continuously love like God loves—without exceptions, and extravagantly.
