THE BIG ASK / THE BIG GIVE

You are probably wondering what this means. Let me explain:

THE BIG ASK

Is me asking anyone willing to spread the word about becoming a living donor. Due to a 46-year battle with a rare form of kidney stones and dozens of surgeries and procedures, I am in stage 5 kidney failure. I am on a waiting list for a kidney transplant, but the wait is currently 4-5 years. By finding a living donor, it would eliminate the wait and provide me a better chance of a successful transplant and longer life span.

THE BIG GIVE

The big give is you or someone you know willing to consider becoming a living donor. There is a completely confidential electronic questionnaire to fill out. The transplant team will review each submission to see if further testing is needed. If you fill out the questionnaire, there is no obligation to be a donor. The web site for the questionnaire is:

Through the entire process, there is no financial burden on the donor. Everything would go through my insurance.
