When Isaiah proclaimed, "Prepare the way of the Lord," it was an announcement of freedom. Seventy years of bondage were over, the iron curtain was down, all were free to leave Babylon. God was coming to lead them to their true home.



We fear Christ will come to judge, to demand, to make us uncomfortable. But the promise is clear: *if any one will open the door, I will come in and eat with them*. It is an invitation to a relationship! And, knowing Jesus, he will be bringing company. But don't worry about the Christmas cookies. He's bringing the meal also. Can you testify to that?


